

Small County Outreach Program (SCOP)

The Small County Outreach Program (SCOP) was developed to assist small county governments in resurfacing, reconstructing, improving capacity, safety improvements, or paving dirt roads. Counties with a population of 150,000 or less based on the most recent population estimate, are eligible for state matching of 75% of the project costs. The county may request a waiver to include 100% of the project costs. Projects are selected by FDOT based on criteria including: whether the county has attempted to keep county roads in satisfactory condition; the physical condition of the road as measured by FDOT; whether a road is used as an evacuation route; whether a road has high levels of agricultural travel; whether a road is considered a major arterial route; whether a project is considered a feeder road; and other criteria as determined by FDOT.

Small County Road Assistance Program (SCRAP)

The purpose of the Small County Road Assistance Program (SCRAP) is to assist small county governments in resurfacing and reconstructing county roads. The term "small county" means any county that has a population of 75,000 or less. Small counties shall be eligible to compete for funds that have been designated for the program for resurfacing or reconstruction projects on county roads that were part of the county road system on June 10, 1995. Capacity improvement on county roads shall not be eligible for funding under the program. This program is fully funded by FDOT.
